Sami Ibrahim Writer

Sami Ibrahim is an award-winning playwright. He co-wrote *Metomorphoses* when he was writer-inresidence at Shakespeare's Globe where it was first performed. Theatre work includes: *A Sudden Burst of Rain*; *two Palestianians go dogging* (winning Theatre Uncut's Political Playwriting Award and nominated for an Olivier Award for Outstanding Achievement in an Affiliate Theatre); *Wonder Winterland*; *the Palestinian in the basement is on fire*; *Wind Bit Bitter*, *Bit Bit Bit Her*; *Iron Dome Fog Dome* and *Carnivore*. Audio credits include: *50 Berkeley Square* (Radio 4); *The Twig* (That Podcast ETT) and *Fledgling* (Radio 4).

Laura Lomas Writer

Laura Lomas is a playwright and screenwriter. Her theatre work includes: after Ovid; Chaos; The Blue Road; Joanne; Bird; Blister; Open Heart Surgery; Come to Where I'm From; Some Machine; The Island; Us Like Gods; Gypsy Girl and Wasteland (shortlisted for the Brian Way Award). Screen writing work includes: Rough Skin (Touchpaper/Channel 4, shortlisted for Best British Short at British Independent Film Awards and Raindance Film Festival) and two episodes of Glue (E4/Eleven Films).

Sabrina Mahfouz Writer

Sabrina Mahfouz is an award-winning playwright, lyricist, poet and screenwriter. Her theatre work includes: A History of Water in the Middle East; Noughts and Crosses; Zeraffa Giraffa (winning Best Production For Young People At The Offies 2018); Beweep/Outcast; Offside (co-writer with Hollie McNish); Battleface; The Love I Feel is Red; With a Little Bit of Luck; Layla's Room; Chef; A Shop Selling Speech; Disnatured; Clean; One Hour Only; Dry Ice. She is the writer on Danny Boyle and Boy Blue's dance adaptation of The Matrix, premiering at The Factory in Manchester, October 2023.

Tristan Fynn-Aiduenu Director

British-Ghanaian theatre-maker Tristan Fynn-Aiduenu work aims to stretch the imagination of his audiences with his unique brand of storytelling. Tristan has directed at venues like The Young Vic, Royal Court and the National Theatre. He is an associate director of companies Initiative.dkf,

Brixton House and The Gate Theatre. Tristan is the winner of the 2019 JMK Directors Award and 2021 Best Director award (with Ryan Calais Cameron) for The Black British Theatre-Awards.

Previous work includes multi-award nominated productions *Sweet Like Chocolate Boy* (Jack Studio Theatre/Tobacco Factory Theatres/ Theatre Peckham), *Little Baby Jesus* (Orange Tree Theatre), the Olivier nominated *For Black Boys who have considered suicide when hue gets too heavy* (Nouveau Riche/New Diorama Theatre/Royal Court/West End), *Bootycandy* (Gate Theatre), *Sundown Kiki Reloaded* (Young Vic) and *Rumble In The Jungle* (Rematch Live/Dock X – as Writer).

Mark Macey Associate Director

Mark Macey is an MFA Theatre Directing candidate at University of London, Birkbeck. A graduate of Dell'Arte International's Professional Training Program, they also hold a BA in Theatre Studies. Before moving to London, Mark was the Executive Artistic Director of Stage East, a semi-professional theatre on the coast of Maine. 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
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
