Biographies

Simon Longman Writer

Simon Longman is a playwright from the West Midlands. He is the recipient of the 49th George Devine Award for Most Promising Playwright and has previously won the Channel 4 Playwrights' Scheme. His work has been translated and produced internationally. His theatre work includes: Falling Falling Falling (RWCMD/Young Vic); (Circle Dreams Around) The Terrible, Terrible Past (National Theatre Connections); Patient Light (Eastern Angles); Island Town (Paines Plough); Gundog (Royal Court); Rails (Theatre By The Lake); White Sky (RWCMD/Royal Court); Sparks (Old Red Lion); Milked (Pentabus). He is an Associate Artist at Kestrel Theatre Company, working in prisons around the UK. He also teaches creative writing at Bath Spa University.

Joan Oliver Director

Joan graduated from RADA's three year acting programme in 1993, after which she appeared in a number of theatre, TV, film, and radio productions. Alongside her acting, Joan began establishing herself as a teacher and freelance director. She returned to RADA in 2009, when she became RADA's Education and Outreach Manager, and held this role until 2014, when she took up her position as RADA's Foundation in Acting Course Director. Joan continued in this role until 2021, when she moved into her most recent position as RADA's first Director of Equity. Joan's directing at RADA includes random (debbie tucker green), Rotterdam (Jon Brittain), The Seagull (Anton Chekhov), which she also adapted, NSFW (Lucy Kirkwood), Waiting for Godot (Samuel Beckett) and last year The Sewing Group (E. V. Crowe).

Miriam Dheva-Aksorn Designer

Miriam Dheva-Aksorn is a third-year student on RADA's BA (Hons) in Technical Theatre and Stage Management course, specialising in design and costume. Before joining RADA, Miriam studied Design and Architecture at Chulalongkorn University, where she designed and directed projects for Bangkok Design Week and TEDx. Her previous roles at RADA include Costume Supervisor for *Is God Is* (directed by Ebenezer Bamgboye), Designer for *Picnic at Hanging Rock* (directed by Joshua Roche), and Costume Supervisor/Wardrobe Assistant for *The Cherry Orchard* (directed by Ebenezer Bamgboye).

Miriam has also worked as a Dresser and Scenic Art Assistant on *The Effect* (directed by Gari Jones). *Gundog* marks her latest design role at RADA, where she continues to explore her passion for creating dynamic visual storytelling through set and costume design.

Mila Mussatt Lighting Designer

Mila Mussatt is in her third year on the BA (Hons) in Technical Theatre and Stage Management specialising in lighting design. Born and raised in Chicago, Mila grew up surrounded by a diverse and rich arts culture, inspiring her work. Kleen's Soap Factory (RADA), Lighting Designer, London Contemporary Dance School Collaborations Project (LCDS at The Place). Mila is honoured and thrilled to be working on this project, and is looking forward to future projects at RADA and beyond.

Marco Curcio Sound Designer

Marco is a theatre sound practitioner with more than 15 years of experience working in London's West End Theatres and for the Royal National Theatre. In the last few years he has been concentrating on Sound Design and Sound Recording, working on a variety of drama, art, commercial and educational projects for companies such as the British Council, i-D magazine, TrustPilot, SIFA (Singapore International Festival of the Arts) and the Royal Court Theatre.
