Biographies

Margaret Perry **Writer**

Margaret Perry is a playwright and screenwriter from Cork, based in London. Her screenwriting credits include *The Woman in the Wall* (BBC / Showtime) and *Dead Ringers* (Amazon).

Her theatre credits include: *Porcelain* (Abbey Theatre in Dublin and recorded for BBC Radio 4, starring Jessie Buckley); *Collapsible* ran in London, Dublin and Edinburgh where it won a number of awards; *Paradise Now!* (Bush Theatre / nominated for an Olivier Award in 2023); *Bluets* an adaptation of Maggie Nelson's celebrated poetry / prose hybrid (Royal Court, directed by Katie Mitchell, and starring Ben Whishaw and Emma D'Arcy).

She has been part of the Soho Writers Lab, the Royal Court Young Writers Programme, the Royal Court Supergroup 2019, led by Alice Birch and Alistair McDowell, and was a BFI Flare X Bafta Mentee in 2021, mentored by Sean Durkin.

Nicole Charles **Director**

Nicole Charles is a director for TV, Film and Theatre. Nicole attended the BRIT school where she studied theatre, trained as an actor at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art and conducted further postgraduate study at Goldsmiths university.

Nicole recently directed the second block of *Passenger*, created by Andrew Buchan, and produced by Sister North for ITV. *Passenger* explores a close-knit community who are unwilling to face their fears of change, of outsiders and of the unknown. Nicole also directed *The Following Events Are Based on a Pack of Lies*, a comedy drama thriller written by Penelope and Ginny Skinner, with Sister Pictures. Nicole was Shadow Director on drama series *Save Me Too* (for Sky Atlantic), and directed the award-winning documentary *Hair Power: Me and My Afro* for C4 series, which won both the Cannes Silver Lion Awards and the Campaign Media Award for Branded Content: TV & Cinema. It was also nominated for Best Specialist Documentary at Broadcast Awards 2021. In 2024, she won one of six places at the BBC Academy for TV Directors.

Nicole's first theatre production *Emilia* by Morgan Lloyd-Malcolm won three Olivier Awards following a run at the Vaudeville Theatre after transferring from The Globe. Following five-star reviews, Nicole's second theatre production, *Sing Yer Heart Out for the Lads* by Roy Williams transferred from

Chichester Festival Theatre to the Royal National Theatre, before cancellation due to the pandemic. In 2020, Nicole was named amongst Edinburgh TV Festival's prestigious 'The Victor Adebodun Debut Director Award' nominees. She currently has a slate of projects in development with writers Ben Tagoe, Penelope Skinner and Morgan Lloyd Malcolm.

Maria (ZhiYi) Liu **Set Designer**

Maria is in her second year on RADA's FdA in Technical Theatre and Stage Management course, specialising in prop making and design. In the last two years, she has worked as a prop maker for *Yerma* (RADA, Gielgud Theatre) and *Mirandolina* (RADA, Jerwood Vanbrugh Theatre). Previous design project includes *Brand*. Outside of RADA, Maria has worked as a puppet maker for Potted Panto (Wilton's Music Hall).

Elsbeth Green

Costume Designer

Elsbeth is currently in her second year of RADA's FdA in Technical Theatre and Stage Management where she is specialising in theatrical design and costume. This is her first costume design role.

Previous costume supervising credits at RADA include *Yerma* (directed by Sarah Esdaile, designed by Sammy Dowson), *As You Like It* - Shakespeare's for Young Audiences (directed by Gabriella Bird and designed by Sammy Dowson) and *The Tree Showcase 2025* (directed by Donnacadh O'Briain). Additional experience includes costume supervising for the Globe Theatre's Young Company production of *Cressida* (directed by Joanne Howarth).

Elsbeth has also worked as Dresser and Scenic art assistant on *The Sewing Group* (directed by Joan Oliver and designed by Tiffany Yu) and undertaken many roles at RADA working in different technical departments to build a thorough understanding of the process involved in making works for stage. Elsbeth hopes to continue working on set and costume design in the future.

Caitlin MacGregor **Lighting Designer**

Caitlin MacGregor is an emerging lighting designer, in her final year of the BA (Hons) in Technical Theatre and Stage Management, specialising

in lighting. Recently, she worked as Associate Lighting Designer alongside Lighting Designer Ben Ormerod on *Hansel and Gretel* at the Royal Academy of Music. At RADA, her credits as Lighting Designer include: *Three Sisters*, RADA's *Winter Cabaret* and *The Winter's Tale* as well as serving as Associate Lighting Designer for *Lab Works* and *Sticks and Stones*. Beyond RADA, her portfolio includes lighting design for *When Atlas Met Tantalus* by Tiff Milner staged at the Lion and Unicorn Theatre, the Bridge House Theatre, and the Greenwich Theatre, as well as *A Show About Tomorrow* by Dom Semwanga, which premiered at last year's Edinburgh Festival Fringe.

Marco Curcio **Sound Designer**

Marco is a theatre sound practitioner with more than 15 years of experience working on London's West End Theatres productions and for the Royal National Theatre.

In the last few years, he has been concentrating on sound design and sound recording, working on a variety of drama, art, commercial, and educational projects for companies such as the British Council, i-D magazine, TrustPilot, SIFA (Singapore International Festival of the Arts), and The Royal Court Theatre.
