Abigail Graham is an award winning theatre director. Forthcoming work includes: *Living* by Leo Butler (Sheffield Crucible)

Work as a director includes: Macbeth, Merchant of Venice (Shakespeare's Globe), Aladdin (Lyric Hammersmith), MUM (Plymouth Drum/Soho Theatre), The Tyler Sisters (Hampstead); 31 Hours (The Bunker); Death of a Salesman (Royal and Derngate/UK tour); And Now: The World! (OpenWorks, UK tour); Timmy Failure: Mistakes Were Made (Assembly Rooms); Debris (OpenWorks, Southwark Playhouse); Molly Sweeney (Print Room/Lyric Belfast.)

Outside of his studies, Tomer has a strong interest in scenic automation and emerging stage technologies. He is particularly drawn to projects that explore how technical design can serve storytelling in innovative ways. He is keen to develop a career in the UK and international live performance industry, where he hopes to contribute as both a sound designer and technical collaborator.
