Biographies

Robbie Bowman Director

Robbie trained as an actor at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama, London (1983-86). In 1998-99, he took a year out to study directing with Sam Kogan at the School of the Science of Acting – a Stanislavsky based training. Since then, his training has included Sanford Meisner with Scott Williams, Michael Chekhov with Sinead Rushe, and Stanislavsky with Bella Merlin and Mike Alfreds. He also trained in NLP to Master Practitioner Level with ITS.

He has taught at Central School of Speech and Drama, University of Wales Trinity St Davids, the Academy of Live and Recorded Arts, Drama Studio, Guildford School of Acting and currently teaches at the Royal Welsh College of Music and Drama. He also teaches abroad in Italy, Poland, India, Turkey and America.

As an actor he has worked at the RSC, National Theatre, West End, Royal Court, West Yorkshire Playhouse, Young Vic, Sherman Cymru and Abbey Theatre, Dublin.

Directing at The Bristol Old Vic, Bath Theatre Royal, RWCMD, Central and Guildford School of Acting. He is a Co-Director with his partner Elen Bowman of their theatre company - Living Pictures Productions and their land based project near Carmarthen in West Wales called Coed Dylan - Living Pictures Productions Limited.

Designer

Sophie Firth is a set and costume designer for theatre from London, having graduated from the Royal Academy of Dramatic Arts with a BA(Hons) in Technical Theatre and Stage Management specialising in scenic art and design in 2022. Her design credits include *These Demons* (Theatre 503), *Hamlet, Massacre at Paris, Henry VI Parts 1,2&3, Afterlife* and *The Winter's Tale* (Fourth Monkey Actor Training Company) and *Cinderella* and the *Forbidden Ball* (OSO Arts Centre). Her design credits while in training include *Time and the Conways* (Jerwood Vanburgh Theatre), *Stop Kiss* (GBS Theatre) and *Consent* (Gielgud Theatre).

Tomer Calfon Sound Designer

Tomer is a second-year Technical Theatre and Stage Management student at RADA, specialising in sound and stage. Born and raised in Israel, he moved to the UK to pursue world-class training in technical theatre. Over the past year, he has worked across both the Sound and the Technical and Production Management departments in roles including Production Sound Engineer and Technical/Production Manager.

This project marks Tomer's first public Sound Design credit—an exciting milestone in his creative development. It is especially meaningful as it combines his growing passion for sound with his long-standing interest in creating work that engages younger audiences and broadens access to the arts.

Outside of his studies, Tomer has a strong interest in scenic automation and emerging stage technologies. He is particularly drawn to projects that explore how technical design can serve storytelling in innovative ways. He is keen to develop a career in the UK and international live performance industry, where he hopes to contribute as both a sound designer and technical collaborator.

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
