# Biographies

#### Ferdinand Bruckner Writer

Ferdinand Bruckner was born Theodor Tagger in Bulgaria in 1891 but spent his youth in Vienna, Paris and Berlin. His interest lay in a career in music in his early years, however this soon changed to poetry and the theatre. In 1917 he began a literary magazine called *Marsyas* and in 1922 he founded the Berlin Renaissance Theater, which he directed until 1927. His plays, Krankheit der Jugend (Pains of Youth) and Elisabeth von England (Elizabeth of England) were released in 1929 under the name of Ferdinand Bruckner which formally became his name after World War II. Over his career, Bruckner produced seven plays which have been translated into many languages and performed all over the world. He became an advisor to the Schiller Theater in Berlin from 1953 until his death in 1958.

#### Ami Sayers Director

Ami is an actor, writer, director and acting teacher with an MA in Actor Training and Coaching from the Royal Central School Of Speech and Drama. She is currently working towards her PhD at Sussex University, focusing on the female body and acting.

Ami teaches and directs at drama schools including RADA, LAMDA and RCSSD. She is also Co-Principal and Head of Acting at All In Actors. Her directing credits include *Be My Baby* (Park Theatre), *Hamlet* (Cockpit Theatre), *The Tempest* (immersive/site specific) as well as numerous productions as a director and writer at Edinburgh and Camden Fringe.

## Lizzy Leech Set Designer

Recent designs include: Rapture (English Theatre Frankfurt), Dead Girls Rising (Hull Truck and UK tour); The Golden Fleece (Sheffield Theatres); Trueman and the Arsonists (The Roundhouse Camden); A Girl In School Uniform (Leeds Playhouse, New Diorama Theatre and tour); Hansel and Gretel (Theatr Clwyd); The Merchant of Venice (Stafford Festival Shakespeare); The Butterfly Lion (The Barn Theatre, Cirencester); Songlines (HighTide Theatre, UK tour); The Leftovers (Leicester Curve and UK tour); A Table Tennis Play (Walrus Theatre and Theatre Royal Plymouth). Lizzy trained at Bristol Old Vic Theatre School and studied English Literature at Warwick University and in 2020 she was made as associate of the New Diorama Theatre.

As Assistant and Associate Designer she has worked on productions at The National Theatre,

Royal Shakespeare Company and in the West End. Recently Lizzy has been focussing on creating ecologically informed work. In 2023 she was the first theatre designer to be offered a fully funded residency at Cove Park where she explored environmentally sustainable processes. She is currently undertaking a 12 month period of development researching eco-dramaturgy, indigenous practice and locality, funded by Arts Council England. <u>lizzyleech.com</u>

Nathan is in his final year of RADA's BA (Hons) in Technical Theatre and Stage Management specialising in lighting. 
