Film/TV credits include: *Three* by Amelia Sears and Matti Houghton, *Ceres* by Hannah Morrish. Amelia was selected as one of the BFI LFF Cohort 2024. Her debut feature is currently in development with Fine Line Productions.

Sammy Dowson Set Designer

Sammy trained in theatre design at the Slade School of Fine Art. She was Resident Designer at the Orange Tree Theatre in Richmond from 2000 -2016, designing over 70 in-the-round productions, notably with Sam Walters, Sean Holmes, Christopher Morahan, Caroline Smith, Peter Leslie Wild, Chris Monks, Alan Strachan, Martin Crimp, Auriol Smith, Tim Sheader, Ellie Jones, David Lewis, and Tim Carroll.

Since 2014 Sammy has designed multiple works for, The Oldham Coliseum, Chipping Norton Theatre (touring), The Dukes Lancaster (touring). In London: The Other Palace, The Arcola, Latchmere 503 (Offie nominated) and Arts and Gardens (Outdoor). Since 2015 Sammy has lectured in Text Analysis and Crafts for Theatre Practice at Central School for Speech and Drama also designing extensively for the MA Acting and BATP Crafts courses.

For RADA Sammy has previously designed *Gaslight*, Shook, *Midsummer Nights Dream*,

As you like It, The Winter's Tale and Yerma.

In 2020 Sammy became an associate of BOLD theatre in Elephant and Castle, a space dedicated to new and site specific theatre and film, nurturing talent and sharing creative practice with emerging theatre makers.

Matt Leventhall Lighting Designer

Matt Leventhall is a lighting designer and educator, and currently Head of Lighting at RADA in London. He designs regularly for RADA productions and consults internationally on lighting design, management and systems. Recent consultancy includes the Royal Court Theatre, Theatre by the Lake, Alexandra Palace Theatre and the National School of Drama, New Delhi. He has also been a judge for the PLASA Awards for Innovation in 2024 and 2025.

His professional design work includes *Larry Dean: Dodger* (Bloomsbury Theatre), *Janine Harouni: Manoushe* (Theatre Royal Stratford East), *Every*

Brilliant Thing and Tom's Midnight Garden (Theatre by the Lake), Trial by Laughter (Watermill and UK Tour), No Kids (UK, USA and Hong Kong tour), Yes, Prime Minister! (Theatr Clwyd), The Kraken (Les Enfants Terribles), Turn of the Screw (Mercury and UK tour), The Secret Garden (York Theatre Royal), and Greek (Arcola).

He has been associate lighting designer on productions including *Hamlet* (Kenneth Branagh Theatre Company), *The Comedy About a Bank Robbery* (Criterion) and *My Mother Never Said I Should* (St James Theatre). His work has toured internationally and been seen at venues including the Barbican, Young Vic and Wilton's Music Hall as well as in the USA, Norway, Germany and China.

Marco Curcio Sound Designer

Marco is a theatre sound practitioner with more than 15 years of experience working on London's West End Theatres productions and for the Royal National Theatre.

In the last few years, he has been concentrating on sound design and sound recording, working on a variety of drama, art, commercial, and educational projects for companies such as the British Council, i-D magazine, TrustPilot, SIFA (Singapore International Festival of the Arts), and The Royal Court Theatre.


