Alexi Kaye Campbell Writer

Alexi Kaye Campbell is a playwright and actor. His first play, *Death in Whitbridge* was performed in the Finborough Theatre. His second play, *The Pride*, was produced for the Royal Court Theatre Upstairs for which he was awarded The Critics' Circle Prize for Most Promising Playwright and the John Whiting Award for Best New Play. Other theatre work includes *Apologia* (short-listed for the John Whiting Award and nominated for the Writers' Guild of Great Britain Award for Best Theatre Play), *Bracken Moor* and *Sunset at the Villa Thalia*. *The Faith Machine* is his fourth play which was first performed at the Royal Court Theatre in 2011. His film script, *Woman in Gold* stared Helen Mirren and Ryan Reynolds and was produced by BBC Films.

Tim Hoare Director

Tim Hoare has been directing theatre for over ten years with some of the best venues and practitioners in the country. Trained as a director at Chichester and the National, as well as as a writer at the Royal Court, he directed *Jellyfish* by Ben Weatherill at the National Theatre, *Fred's Diner* by Penelope Skinner at Chichester Festival Theatre, *Romeo and Juliet* at Shakespeare's Globe, and *Don Juan* and *Love's Labours Lost* for the Golden Age Foundation in Madrid. He was the recast director for Sam Mendes on Jez Butterworth's *The Ferryman* on Broadway and the West End, which secured Tony Awards for best play and best direction.

Liberty Monroe Designer

Liberty is in her third year at RADA on the BA (Hons) in Technical Theatre and Stage Management specialising in scenic art and design. Her previous work includes *When the Rain Stops Falling* (Set Designer, Jerwood Vanbrugh Theatre), *Plaques and Tangles* (Head of Scenic Art, Jerwood Vanbrugh Theatre), *Monster* (Head of Scenic Art, Gielgud Theatre), and *Pomona* (Set Designer, Gielgud Theatre). This is her third design at RADA.

Sammy Emmins Lighting Designer

Joining RADA in 2019, Sammy is versatile and multi-disciplined lighting designer and technician coming from the respected drama program at King's College in Wimbledon. Sammy thrives on creating technically challenging designs which deliver a memorable experience for the audience. His credits include small to large productions, immersive events, and representations at the Edinburgh Fringe festival.

Sammy is in his final year of training at RADA. His RADA lighting credits include *The Faith Machine*, *Time and the Conways*, *Dinner*, *Much Ado About Nothing* and *Kursk*.

Other notable work as lighting designer includes; Cartas Vivas (Cervantes Theatre), Don't Sit Under The Apple Tree (Edinburgh Fringe), Jesus Christ Superstar (Immersive), Equus, Blood In/Blood Out, Joseph and Hamlet.

As associate lighting designer; *King Lear*, *Consent* (RADA) and *His Dark Materials*.
